Sabine Early Childhood Community Network promotes school readiness by providing a safe, nurturing, child-centered environment for children to learn and grow, while engaging families as active partners.

Analysis of Current State

ACCESS

Sabine Early Childhood Community Network currently serves approximately 318 children, ages birth to four at eight sites. The majority of these sites are pre-kindergarten, four-year-old classes situated at seven school campuses throughout Sabine Parish. One school, Many Elementary School, also houses Many Preschool Center. Many Preschool Center serves threeyear-old children in four classrooms. The network has one publically funded childcare facility, Faithlynn's Learning Academy, LLC, that serves approximately 35 children, birth to four years.


QUALITY


Data from performance profiles demonstrates an Excellent rating for Sabine Early Childhood Community Network. Continuous growth is achieved through recruitment and retention of certified staff, high-quality professional development related to implementation of high-quality curriculum, improving instructional practices, and targeted teacher-coaching.

STRENGTHS

There are two notable strengths for Sabine Early Childhood Community Network: access for four-year old children and high-quality programs. Through braiding of funds, the network offers a seat to all four-year-old children in Sabine Parish; therefore, achieving a success rate of 100% in the area of access for at-risk four-year-old children. Based on 2022-2023 data, Sabine's programs are also high-quality: 100% of sites are rated overall as High Proficient or above, 100% of sites are using a Tier I curriculum, 100% of sites have a three-star rating for teacher/child ratio, and 63% of certified educators.






AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

Contrastingly, access and scores in instructional support are weaknesses for the Sabine Early Childhood Community Network/Sabine Ready Start Network.

The network only serves about 58% of three-year olds, 13% of two-year-olds, 9% of oneyear- olds, and 6% of infants.



With a strong emphasis on kindergarten readiness, a second area for improvement is instructional support as measured by the CLASS observation tool. Instructional support, although improving, continues to rate Below Proficient. For children to be prepared for kindergarten, this dimension must improve.

While Sabine's efforts for four-year old children are exemplary, there is room for improvement regarding access and quality for children.

Goals and Strategies: Goal #1

ACCESS

Increase enrollment at-risk birth to three-year-old children in high-quality early childhood programs for the 2023-2024 school year by 10%.

STRATEGY #1: Provide more birth to three-year-old seats at childcare centers.

STRATEGY #2: Secure grant funding to serve more children birth to five.

STRATEGY #3: Increase recruitment efforts of children birth to age three.

Resources

Existing

Buy-In: Network partners recognize the need to serve more children birth to three-years-old

Facilities: Local publically-funded child care center is licensed and equipped to add additional seats

Availability: Many children are on a wait-list and available to fill vacant seats

Coordinated Enrollment: Families have access to enroll children birth to three-years during universal Pre-K enrollment

Needed

Financial Resources: Current funding may not support the cost of personnel needed to serve children birth to three-years-old

Additional Funding for Recruitment Activities: Extended hours of staff for open house at local day care, advertisements for local newspaper of available seats, advertisements for local radio of available seats

PERFORMANCE METRICS: Increased enrollment of children birth to three-years-old

Goals and Strategies: Goal #2

QUALITY

With an increase in teacher turnover, the network plans to sustain the "Proficient" instructional support performance rating for Sabine Early Childhood Community by May 2024.

<u>STRATEGY #1:</u> Provide targeted, job-embedded, classroom-based coaching for new teachers and teachers scoring below proficient on the instructional support domain of CLASS.

<u>STRATEGY #2:</u> Train and utilize early childhood teacher leaders to provide high-quality professional development, focusing on CLASS and effective facilitation techniques.

<u>STRATEGY #3:</u> Provide guidance and structures for professional learning communities so teachers are equipped to implement the Tier I curriculum with intentionality and fidelity.

Resources

Existing

High-Quality Curriculum: All sites in the network implement Tier I curriculum

Instructional Staff: Current education staff available for classroom-based coaching and to support professional learning communities

Needed

Funding: Ensure that funding is allocated for new initiatives (training teacher leaders, stipends, training for professional learning communities)

Structures for Professional Learning Communities: Expand mentorship among teachers to share effective teaching strategies that align with the CLASS framework.

<u>PERFORMANCE METRICS:</u> Increased CLASS score in instructional support for Sabine Early Childhood Community Network

Goals and Strategies: Goal #3

SUPPORTING FAMILIES

Through trainings and collaborative partnerships, 75% of parents of enrolled children will gain knowledge and confidence to support their child's learning at the conclusion of the 2023-2024 school year.

STRATEGY #1: Provide training opportunities for parents to develop knowledge of children's growth and development and leadership skills to advocate on their child's behalf.

STRATEGY #2: Train staff on developing and maintaining positive, trusting relationships with families that support growth and success for children.

STRATEGY #3: Create opportunities for families to collaborate with staff on developing and supporting goals for their children.
